Report on the audit of the financial statements

I have audited the financial statements of Crime Victims Helpline ("the Company") for the year ended 31 December 2018 which comprise the Statement of Income and Expenditure, the Balance Sheet and notes to the financial statements, including the summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 1. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is Irish law and Financial Reporting Standard 102 applicable in Ireland.
